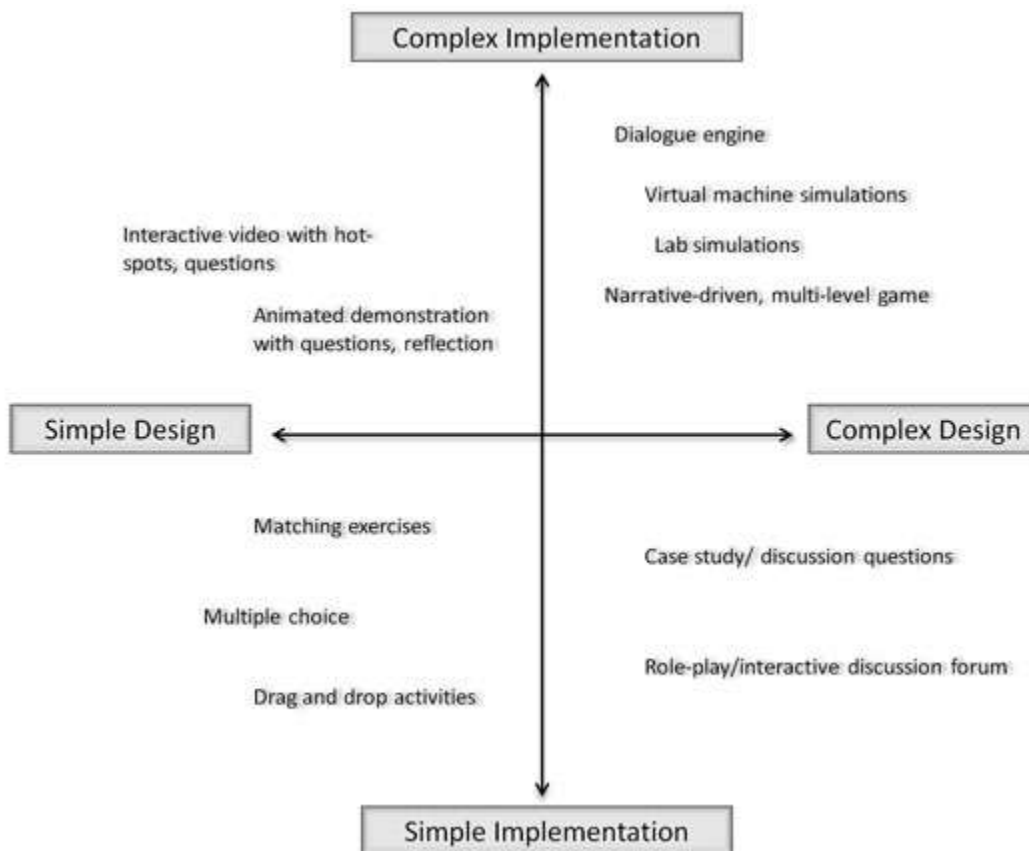


## ILO Complexity Grid

“Interactive learning object,” or “ILO,” is our generic term for any online activity that demands some input from the user in order to function—basically, anything more complicated than a simple, “watch this video, read this article” format. Every ILO can be graphed according to two values: the complexity of its design and the complexity of its implementation.



This grid may be used in a variety of ways:

- Use the grid as a communication tool with the instructor-expert.
- Find examples on the web or in your team’s portfolio that match each area to use as starting points.
- Use the Interactivity calculator (<http://www.webcourseworks.com/showcase/game-calculator>) to help determine the cost of added interactivity.
